

CREDIT STUDENTS

1. Application: Complete the application and return it with the \$35.00 application fee. (This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable)
2. Questionnaire: Complete the Questionnaire section
3. WBC/CBS Doctrinal Statement: Read and sign our doctrinal statement indicating essential agreement.
4. References: Place your name on the reference forms and have them completed by the appropriate people. One form must be completed by your pastor, youth pastor, or church leader. The other reference forms must be completed by a teacher or employer. Three references are preferred however a minimum of two may be accepted. All references must have known you for at least one year.
5. Transcript:
 - a. School Transcripts are required for applicants with fewer than 15 hours of college credit.
 - b. Official Undergraduate Transcripts with GPA and degree conferred are required for all CBS applicants.
6. Standardized Tests:
 - a. WBC applicants are required to submit SAT or ACT exam scores. If you have not taken the SAT or ACT, please contact the Admissions office for alternative testing options.
 - b. The GRE Aptitude Test is required of CBS applicants who have less than a 2.5 GPA from an Undergraduate institution.
7. Health Exam Form: Have your physician complete the Health Exam Form and Meningitis Waiver (only need meningitis waiver if you plan to live on campus). Health exam forms must be completed by full time students .
8. Housing Application: Complete the housing application only if you plan to live on campus and mail it to the Director of Admissions.

AUDIT AND VISITING STUDENTS

A visiting student is any part-time student, taking no more than 6 credit hours, who is not seeking to complete his degree at WBC/CBS. An auditing student is any part-time student who takes a class to gain knowledge rather than for credit.

1. Application: Complete the application and return it with the \$35.00 application fee. (This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable)
2. Questionnaire: Complete the Questionnaire section
3. WBC/CBS Doctrinal Statement: Read and sign our doctrinal statement saying that you will respect the views of WBC/CBS even though you may not agree with all points.
4. References: Please complete ONLY the Pastor's Reference following the instructions in #4 above.
5. Transcripts (Visiting Student): Official transcripts are required. You will be considered either a Freshman or a Transfer Student. See appropriate section for details. (If you are planning to transfer your credits to another institution, ACT/SAT scores are not required.)
6. Transcripts (Auditing Student): One of the following are required (photocopies are accepted): High School Transcript, High School Diploma, College Transcripts

FIRSTLOOK STUDENTS

A FirstLook is a student wishing to experience one class at WBC/CBS without commitment. He/she may wish to upgrade, earning credit for that class at any point during the semester. FirstLook students must fulfill application requirements if upgrading to credit later into the semester.

1. Application: Complete the application and return it with the \$35.00 application fee. (This fee is non-refundable and non-transferable)
2. WBC/CBS Doctrinal Statement: Read and sign our doctrinal statement saying that you are in essential agreement and will respect the non-essential views of WBC/CBS even though you may not agree with all points.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

1. THE SCRIPTURES

We believe the Bible is the inerrant Word of God, verbally inspired in the whole and in the parts, the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21).

2. GOD

We believe in one God, eternally existing in three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, who created all things (Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 5:3-4; Hebrews 1:1-3; Genesis 1:1).

We believe in the historicity of the entire narrative of Genesis, including God's creation of the material universe in six literal days, a literal Adam and Eve as the parents of all mankind, a literal fall, and a universal flood (Exodus 20:9-11; Romans 5:12; 2 Peter 2:5).

We believe in the virgin birth, the sinless perfection, the bodily resurrection and ascension into heaven of Jesus Christ, and in His present life there for us as High Priest and Advocate (Matthew 1:20-23; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; Acts 1:9; Romans 8:34).

3. MAN

We believe that man was created in the image of God, that he disobeyed God and thereby incurred spiritual death, which is separation from God, and also physical death as a consequence; and that all the Adamic race are sinners by nature and practice (Genesis 1:26-27; Romans 5:12-19; 7:15-21).

4. ANGELS

We believe that God created sinless, spiritual beings called angels to worship and serve Him (Colossians 1:16; Isaiah 6:3; Hebrews 1:14).

We believe that Satan and some of the angels became proud and were judged by God and that Satan now rules these fallen angels called demons (1 Timothy 3:6; Matthew 25:41; Ephesians 6:11-12; 2 Corinthians 4:4).

5. SALVATION

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for our sins as a vicarious, substitutionary sacrifice, and that all who believe in Him are justified on the basis of His shed blood, and are born of the Holy Spirit and thereby become the children of God (Romans 5:8-9; 1 Corinthians 15:3; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Romans 3:24-26; John 3:3-6; John 1:12).

We believe those born again by the Spirit of God have eternal salvation and can never be lost (Romans 8:28-39; John 10:27-30; Romans 5:1-11).

6. THE CHURCH

We believe the Church is an elect company of believers baptized by the Holy Spirit into one body; its mission is to witness concerning its head, Jesus Christ, preaching the Gospel among all nations (Ephesians 1:3-4; 1 Corinthians 12:13; Acts 1:8).

We believe that water baptism and the Lord's Supper are the ordinances of the Church in this age (1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Acts 2:41).

We believe the Christian is not under the Law but that the grace of God is sufficient for the maintenance of a life of obedience to the Word of God (Romans 6:14; John 14:15; 2 Peter 3:18).

We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells, seals, and gives spiritual gifts to every believer; and that He guides, fills, teaches, and enables every believer to do the will of God as the believer trusts and obeys the Spirit (Romans 8:9; Ephesians 4:30; 1 Corinthians 12:7-11; Galatians 5:16-18; Ephesians 5:18; 1 John 2:27).

We believe the sign gifts of the Holy Spirit, such as speaking in tongues and the gift of healing, were temporary and that speaking in tongues was never the common or necessary sign of the baptism or the filling of the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 2:20; Hebrews 2:3-4; 1 Corinthians 14:1-40).

We believe that ultimate deliverance of the body from sickness or death awaits the consummation of our salvation in the resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:50-54; 2 Corinthians 12:7-10).

We believe that God frequently chooses to answer the prayer of believers for physical healing (James 5:14-18).

7. LAST THINGS

We believe the order of the end time events will be as follows: (1) the personal, physical return of Jesus Christ to rapture the Church; (2) the seven year tribulation period; (3) the personal, visible return of Jesus Christ to the earth to establish His earthly kingdom which will continue for 1,000 years; (4) the final judgment and eternal state (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Daniel 9:24-27; 1 Thessalonians 5:9; Revelation 3:10; Matthew 24:5-21; Revelation 6:1-19:21; Isaiah 11:1-10; Revelation 19:11-21; 20:1-3, 11-15; 21:1-22:5).

We believe in the bodily resurrection of the just and the unjust, the ever-lasting blessedness of the saved, and the everlasting punishment of the lost (Daniel 12:1-2; Revelation 21:1-22:5; 1 Thessalonians 4:17; 1 Corinthians 15:20-58; Matthew 25:41, 46; John 5:28-29; Revelation 20:11-15).

Every Bible college and seminary teaches the Word of God within some doctrinal framework. The doctrinal position of Washington Bible College / Capital Bible Seminary is that of conservative, evangelical Christianity. We rest firmly in the integrity and inerrancy of the Scriptures and support the historic doctrines of Protestant Christian faith. Members of the faculty sign their agreement to this entire position annually and teach these doctrines in the classroom.

To graduate from Washington Bible College / Capital Bible Seminary, students need to be in essential agreement with the doctrinal position. Essential agreement with the doctrinal position means that while students may have other views on creation (#2), the security of the believer (#5), the sign gifts (#6), or the end-time events (#7), they are in agreement in every other area. Students are required to respect WBC/CBS's views even if they do not agree with some of them. Respect includes not being argumentative in the classroom and not actively promoting or practicing a different position on campus or proselytizing other students.
